A Word from the NWC Superintendent Mark R. Stromberg ...

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

As you prepare to meet for your congregational annual meeting, I want to extend a word of greeting, challenge and encouragement as you reflect back on the ways that God's Spirit has been active in your midst in the past year; even as you have sought to be faithful in your calling to be salt and light in your community.

As ECC President Gary Walter has observed, ministry has never been easy. However, we all sense that the incline has become even steeper in recent years. Those entering ministry (and the churches they serve) are facing challenges that were not even on the radar in the past. As such, we are mindful of our need to seek God's presence and guidance with all of our hearts.
